



What to Bring

- An open mind and a Servant's Heart
- Sleeping bag and pillow/or twin sheet set and blanket
- Comfortable clothes for time spent around camp
- P.J.'s that are appropriate to walk the halls at CRD to get to the showers
- Appropriate clothes if your plans include touring Detroit
- Underwear/socks
- Shower shoes

- Personal hygiene items (soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, girl's feminine needs, etc)
- Bath towels/wash clothes
- Dirty laundry bag
- Sunscreen
- Sunglasses
- Insect repellent
- Prescription medicines
- First aid supplies
- Special dietary items, if needed.
- Picture ID
- Flashlight
- Styrofoam cooler (for lunches on job site)
- Reusable water bottle
- Missing paperwork and/or money for your leader (intake forms, etc.)
- Backpack (optional)
- Phone (if group leader allows you to have one)
- Phone charger/power bank
- Camera (if not on your phone)
- Cards/games/gym equipment for down time (CRD has some)
- Spending money - especially if you are going to tour Detroit

For the Work Day

- Long work pants
- Long sleeve shirts (even in the summer, bring at least one)
- Sturdy boots or closed toe shoes
- Safety goggles or glasses (recommended)
- Heavy work gloves (recommended)
- Hat or Bandana
- Work clothes you are not afraid to get dirty.
- Clothes should be comfortable but modest. (For your safety, dress conservatively at all times.)
- Closed toe shoes
- Jacket in case of rain

CRD suggests that crop tops, tube tops, short shorts, and the like not be worn at any time. Shorts can be worn, when appropriate. However, Bermuda or mid-length are recommended.
